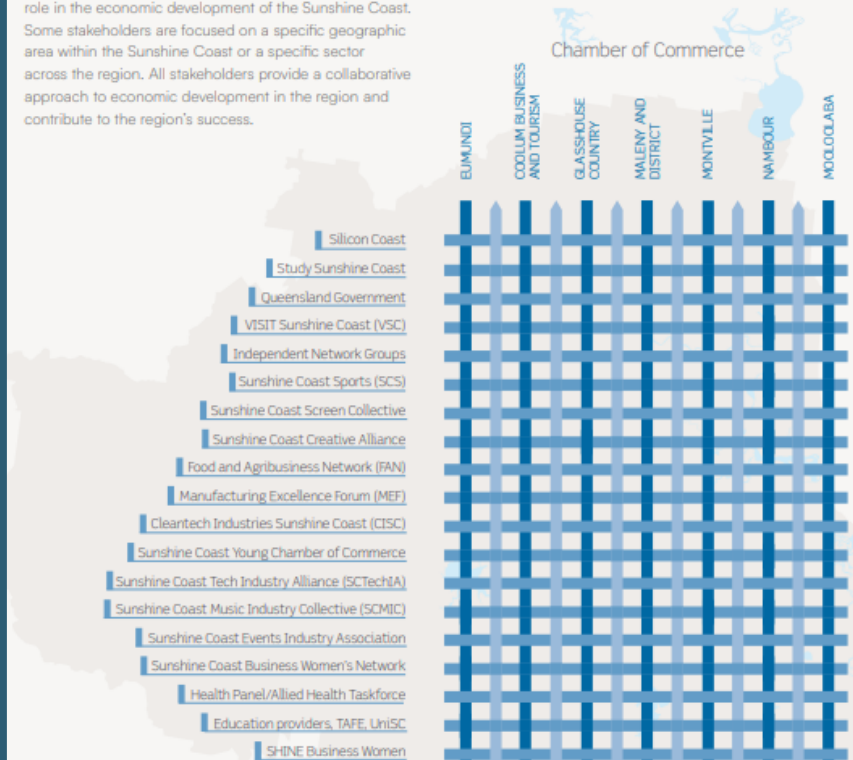
Fabric of Collaboration
